



Holy Trinity Church - Reopening of the church building

The church building

1. A risk-assessment has concluded it is safe to re-open the church.
2. Our cleaners have conducted a spring clean.
3. Entry and exit to the building is through the main entrance. We ask people to keep a safe distance when at the door. We enter the nave of the church (the worshipping space) through the Entrance door and exit through the large doors via the Lounge.
4. Plastic chairs are laid out 2m apart. There are 33 chairs in the church nave and 7 chairs in the gallery. People from the same household can sit together.
5. There are hand sanitiser dispensers around the church. People are encouraged to use them as they enter and leave the building, as well as before receiving Holy Communion.
6. The plastic chairs will be wiped clean after each service.
7. The toilets are open. However, people are encouraged to use them as little as possible at this time.
8. The kitchen is closed for the time being.
9. People can wear face coverings and are encouraged to do so.

The Eucharist celebration

1. The service is going to be a **said Eucharist** celebration. The service will start at 9.30am and will last for about 45 minutes. There will continue to be an 11.00am online service.
2. Please keep a physical distance of 2m between households at all times.



4. There will be no Sunday club and the Children's Room is closed. However, children are very welcome to join the service and parents and carers will be responsible for them abiding to the 2m social distance.

4. There will be no singing. Music will be played for us on the organ and piano.

5. Order of service: You will find a hard copy of the order of service on each plastic chair. You are encouraged to keep the order of service and bring it with you next time you attend.

6. Peace will be shared by sign language or by bowing our heads and saying *'Peace be with you'*.

7. There will be no collection plate during the service. However, we would very much appreciate your financial support and we encourage you to make donations online.

8. Holy Communion will be distributed as bread only.
The words of distribution (The Body of Christ) will be said only once from the Altar. Fr Marius will sanitise his hands. To receive Communion please approach the Altar in a line, one by one, at a safe distance. The consecrated bread will be placed into your hands, without words.

9. After the service, we can stay in the building and have conversations abiding the 2m rule.
